A phonological disorder is a speech sound disorder that affects the PHONOLOGICAL (phonemic) level. The child has difficulty organizing their speech sounds into a system of sound patterns (phonemic patterns). The difference between an Articulation and a Phonological disorder; An articulation disorder is the child's difficulty at a phonetic/motoric level. They have trouble making the individual speech sounds.
