Violin Finger Charts. Violin finger charts are a quick, visual way for beginner violinists to understand the geography of the violin fingerboard. Simple diagrams to show finger placing can also help in early note reading. Tutor books such as C. Paul Herfurth ' s A Tune A Day traditionally combine finger charts with music theory and note-reading exercises to help build a clear understanding of how the position of each finger on the violin strings relates to the notes on the staff.

The scale ' s split into two easy to remember patterns. On the G and D strings, the first and second fingers are a whole note apart, whilst the third finger is just a half note away. Think of this as: stretched, stretched, close. On the E and A strings, the middle finger is close to the first finger, whilst the third finger is a whole note away.

Here are a few violin fingering charts for the most common beginning scales. When you first start playing you may start by learning one new finger at a time. Once you have a first, second and third finger under your belt, you can start on your scales. D major (1 octave) or G major (1 or two octaves) are the most common to begin with since they have easy finger patterns to remember, and avoid the F natural on the E string which can be a bit awkward to start with.

The blue bars on the sides of the chart represent the usual possibilities for beginners' tape placements, at 1st, high 2nd, 3rd (and 4th) fingers, or Bornoff pattern number 2. This particular pattern results in an A major scale on the A and E strings, which is a natural start for simple tunes like "Twinkle Twinkle Little Star".

First Position Notes for the Violin This is a chart to help beginning violin students learn to read music. It consists of a staff and treble clef and notes - low G to high B - that show all of the first position notes and their fingerings, color coded by string. It can be printed and posted on a bulletin board or handed out.

The intention of this book is to illustrate where the fingers of the left hand are placed on the fingerboard of the violin. The diagrams showing the relative positions of the fingers in each key are complemented by music notation. No attempt is made to show the exact positions of the fingers on the fingerboard, since this depends on several factors. What is shown is where two fingers are either close together, as for a semi-tone, or further apart, as for a tone. The first four positions are illustrated for all keys. Those patterns can then be repeated for the higher positions.

Learning to play a variety of scales makes you a better musician. It teaches your fingers where to find and how to handle the different positions you might encounter when playing pieces of music; it trains your musical ear by helping you to learn to recognise intervals and how they relate to finger positioning; and ultimately it trains your musical brain how to recognise different musical colours and eventually create them on the fly.
